

When we started the course, we had a classroom full of women; towards the end, twenty committed ladies completed the course. Now they are eagerly waiting to join the next level." The classes were conducted free of cost, twice a week at the Chembur Campus.

It was indeed a proud moment for the teachers to see their adult students being awarded with certificates of achievement. During the formal function all the twenty participants made

The same poise, confidence and mastery over the content were displayed during the valedictory function as the participants walked up to the stage, introduced themselves and shared their experience about ALD drive."
