




Highlights of February – June 2022




















World Cancer Day 04 February, 2022



On 4th February, 2022 SI Bombay Chembur in association with Pillai College of Education and Research, Chembur, conducted an expert talk on World Cancer Day on the topic – Breast Cancer and Cervical Cancer focusing on breast and Cervical Cancer and raising awareness about early detection, prevention, and care including surgical options for treatment of cancer. 10,11 February, 2022








Safe and Unsafe Touch 19 February, 2022

World Wetlands Day 25 February, 2022






International Women's Day 08 March, 2022

Soroptimist Excellence Awards 2022

SIBC celebrated International Women's Day by conferring the 'SI Excellence Awards 2022' on Ms. Lara Jesani, for her exemplary work in the field of human rights. The award carries a trophy, citation and a donation of Rs. 10,000 to an NGO.

Lara Jesani is an independent litigator in Bombay High Court and National Green Tribunal. She takes up cases of human rights violations, in particular constitutional, environmental, development, and anti-corruption matters, death penalty / criminal cases, and in defense of human rights defenders. In particular, she represents project-affected communities and civil society organizations.

On this occasion, she addressed the audience virtually on the topic 'Gender Justice and the Indian Constitution.' The audience of around 200 for the webinar was -- Soroptimist members from all over India and from our Friendship Links along with students and teachers. Her talk was very motivational as she spoke about her journey and her work during the COVID pandemic which has been highly appreciated.









Post the event, a donation of Rs. 10000/- was made to Parcham Collective, an organization that works with young girls belonging to the Muslim community living in slum communities in Mumbra, Mumbai. The organization through various activities that they conduct, aim at building life skills among girls.

World Environment Day 05 June, 2022





SI Bombay Chembur celebrated World Environmet Day in the month of June in association with several Pillai Group of Institutions. Some of the highlights were as follows:

With the Social Service Committee of Pillai Institute of Management Studies and Research, we conducted an online webinar on 5th June, 2022. The theme for World Environment Day this year is 'Only One Earth'. The objective of this webinar was to raise awareness about the dangers that growing pollution levels and climate change pose to the ecosystem. The esteemed speakers were Mr. Pashupathy Gopalan, CEO of Sunedison and Vilasini Housing and Dr. Pranjal Kumar Phukan, Thought leader and industry expert.

In collaboration with MES's Pillai College of Education and Research we carried out a large plantation drive. The theme of the drive is 'Conserve Indian native flora and fauna'. Under this initiative we will be planting 500 plants in Tribal area of Dindori and Peth Taluka of Nashik district, Maharashtra and 500 plants in Mumbai and Navi Mumbai residential areas. The plants are selected as per the specific habitat of different species of birds to bring their homes back.









World Environment Day "No to Single Use Plastic"







In response to the SIGBI call for dedicated action against single plastic, SI Bombay Chembur conducted various campaigns in the month of June among the students of different ages who have the maximum stake in the sustainable future for the planet. Some of the highlights were as follows:

To inculcate environmental sensitivity from a tender age, a workshop was organized for the toddlers of Edukids International, Mumbai.

Another workshop was organized for the children of Chembur English High School on the theme of recycling. The resource person taught the kids to make cloth bags from old T-shirts.

Along with the Environment Protection Cell of Pillai College of Arts, Commerce and Science, we conducted 2 sessions for the students. On 21st June, an expert talk was delivered by Mr. Ajay Mishra, Founder of Biocrux, on the topic – "India Mechanical Blessing for the Environment". This was followed up on 22nd June with "Mechanics into action - Recycling Plastic". Where the activity was -- Get your plastic bottles, Crush them in the plastic shredder, See the beautiful and useful product made out of plastic threads.

Did You Know?



Savitribai Phule and Fatima Sheikh were the pioneers of girls' education in India. Together, they set up the first school for girls in India in Pune - ensuring that students from non-dominant castes could access education.

They shared the tasks of teaching girls, going from house to house encouraging families to send their girls to the school and managing the affairs of the school.

Savitribai and her husband Jotiba faced immense opposition from the upper caste society for their reformist agenda and were made to vacate their ancestral house. It was Fatima and her brother who provided them and the school a home in the interim period.

The Poona University was renamed as Savitribai Phule University to honour her legacy.
