The Power of a Second Chance: Adult Literacy

Under the banner of our flagship programme, "Power of a Second Chance", this year, SI Bombay Chembur identified the need of spreading computer literacy to those women who did not have an access to formal education. **A 3-week course on Computer Literacy & Skills** was devised and offered in May 2023. Women living in slum communities in Chembur were the beneficiaries. They were taught basics of MS Office, usage of the internet and how to be safe from cybercrime. Our member Ms. Preeti Pawar (President Elect) co-ordinated the course with the help of IT staff at Chembur English High School.



English for Specific Purposes

SIBC in collaboration with Mahatma Education Society's Pillai HOC College of Arts, Science & Commerce, Rasayani organised the 'English for Specific Purposes Workshop' for the Students at Pillai Skill Development Institute from 22nd February 2023 to 3rd March 2023.

The objective of the programme is to enhance language and communication skills of the participants. Various topics of spoken language were covered in the training: Formal and Informal Greetings, Conversations, word games, and Role plays, storytellling. Tips for grooming and effective body language were also shared. The students were given many exercises and practice sessions to improve their self-confidence. During the valedictory function, the particpants showcased their English speaking skills by making short introductions and presenting skits about different states of India. Our founding President Dr. Daphne Pillai addressed the participants and presented the certificates.









16 Days of Activism 2022

The 16 Days of Activism for no Violence against Women and Children Campaign (25 November to 10 December) was observed by SIBC with great enthusiasm and a sense of purpose. Our focus has always been primarily on education.

We believe that the first step towards putting an end to gender based violence is raising awareness among girls and women about their rights and prevailing legal system within which they can seek protection and resolution. With this in mind, we organised separate sessions in which invited experts provided detailed guidance to women. topics of domestic violence, sexual harassment at workplace, protection of children against sexual offences etc.

Stree Mukti Sanghatana and individual lawyers were partners in the project.

Campus, Panvel. **Adv. Rajashree Damle** spoke to Night Degree college students on legal rights of women. a 2-day workshop for the girls of Mahatma Junior College of education, Chembur.









Project ASHA

SI Bombay Chembur in association with NGO, Don Bosco's Nerul helped two women entrepreneurs from marginalised communities by giving them financial aid for their businesses. After a need assessment and interview with a few women of the Don Bosco Skill Development Course, **Rajeshwari** Lalmani and Amina Mustaq Sayed were chosen and given financial aid of ₹ 5,000/- (each towards helping build their small businesses of opening vegetables stalls. This initiative will help these women start and grow their businesses, eventually aiding them in their journey to financial independence. SIBC will continue to support and mentor them through this process.







ADARSH: Village Adoption Project

SIBC members visited their **adopted village**, **Warmali** for a talk on gender violence for the village women. Biscuits, colour boxes and books were distributed to the children of the village and discussions were had with the women about the issue of lack of water source in the village.

Awareness on Narcotics and Drug Abuse

SI Bombay Chembur and Chembur English High School with **Chembur Police Station** conducted an awareness session on narcotics and drug abuse for the students in the age group of 14 to 16 years.



Project Sashakt

Soroptimist International Bombay Chembur in collaboration with **Stree Mukti Sanghatana** conducted a 2-day workshop in December, for the girls of Mahatma Junior College of education, Chembur. The workshop covered topics on rights, sexuality and gender equality.





Medical Testing Camp

SIBC in collaboration with the Women Development Cell of Pillai College of Architecture conducted a testing camp for measuring the



random blood sugar, hemoglobin levels and bone density of female students and staff of Pillai Campus. **Dr. Kirti Samudra** (M.D. Physician and Diabetologist) along with her lab technicians tested and counselled 206 girls and women.

Blanket Collection and Distribution Drive 2022-23

SIBC distributed around 250 blankets and 3 boxes of warm clothes to street dwellers in Navi Mumbai in January 2023. This was much needed with temperatures dropping in Mumbai. 500 biscuit packets were also distributed among children living on the street.



Did You Know?

Tarabai Shinde (1850-1910) is credited with creating the first piece of feminist literature in Marathi. She came from a high caste family and was educated at home by her father. She worked with Savitribai Phule to improve the life and circumstances of lower classes. She gave voice to the terrible punishment meted out to young Brahmin widows, who, with no males to protect them, were prey to abuse from male relatives and often became pregnant. She wrote on this in a diatribe titled, *'Stree Purush Tulana'* or 'A Comparison Between Women and Men' in 1882.
